Community Survey

- Process
 - Had one orientation program to Enumerator
 - Selected the community by coordination group
 - Preliminary meeting conduct with the expert persons of the respective community
 - Community survey took a 2 days long for each community
 - First day: Orientation on Indigenous peoples rights including UNDRIP, SDGs, Gender
 - Second day: Fill up survey questions

Community Survey

- Respondent are:
 - Composition of Women (more than 33%), Youths, Adult (60 years and above), persons with disability, children's too
 - Community expert persons, Government School teacher, Health worker, Local political leader, local government representative and officials
 - Indigenous leaders
